An integrated PET/CT scan combines images from a positron emission tomography (PET) scan and a computed tomography (CT) scan that have been performed at the same time using the same machine. A CT scan provides detailed pictures of tissues and organs inside the body, while a PET scan reveals any abnormal activity. Combining these scans creates a more complete image than either test can offer alone.

PET/CT Metabolic Neurologic exams are done to either differentiate different types of dementia or to identify new tumor versus treatment changes in the brain.

<p> If your doctor has told you to take your regular medicine, you may take it with water.</p> <p> Wear comfortable loose fitting clothing that is easy to remove.</p> <p> Do not consume nicotine or caffeine for 4 hours prior to your exam</p>	<p> No food 6 hours prior to exam</p> <p> Do drink 32 ounces of water within 4 hours of exam. You may use the restroom as needed, you do not need to hold your bladder</p> <p> Plan to be at the testing center for 1½ to 2 hours. It is important to arrive on time. If you cannot arrive on time, please call 24 hours in advance to reschedule your test.</p> <p> A PET/CT scan is not painful but it requires patience. You will receive an injection in advance of the scan. It takes 60 minutes for the material to be distributed throughout your body. During this time you will be asked to relax comfortably in a recliner in a quiet room. You will also need to be still for the entire scan, which takes 20 minutes depending on what your doctor has ordered.</p>	<p> Drink at least 1 liter (4 cups) of water during the course of the day.</p> <p> You may eat and drink without restrictions.</p> <p> A highly specialized radiologist will interpret your images and prepare a diagnostic report for your physician. The results of our study will be reported to your physician within 24 hours. We provide consultation and analysis of the scans and collaborate with your physician if requested. However, only your physician is authorized to report the results to you.</p>

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
